"Urusvati (*Urusvati is Helena Roerich*) knows that even great men of action reveal different qualities in each incarnation. The impulse of growing consciousness will indicate the different ways in which one can search. And We help in such a search.

We direct the attention of the person concerned to a new book. We stimulate useful turns of conversation. We send thoughts about new discoveries. We imperceptibly prevent harmful errors. It is a joy to render help unnoticed. We appreciate it when the fighters courageously ward off the blows of darkness. May people remember from time to time how they were taught in the Subtle World, how light beings approached them and how the growth of consciousness gave the teachers the opportunity to approach them. It is exactly the same in earthly life."
